A SCHOLARSHIP DESIGNED WITH YOU IN MIND

In addition to the many scholarship, grant and loan opportunities available to all students, OU offers a scholarship designed exclusively for incoming out-of-state students. The **Tuition Differential Scholarship** is offered to incoming freshmen who are not residents of the state of Michigan, and who have a high school GPA of 3.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale. The scholarship provides tuition at the in-state rate. Students receiving this award are required to live in on-campus housing.
